# **City, County Confirm New COVID-19 Related Deaths**

**LAREDO, Texas** – The City of Laredo and Webb County have **THREE** new confirmed deaths related to COVID-19. The City and County want to express their most sincere condolences to the families of those who have lost a loved one through this pandemic and want them to know that counselors and teams are available to support them.

- The 924<sup>th</sup> death of a Webb County resident was a female in her late-50s. She died on Monday, September 13, 2021.
- The 925<sup>th</sup> death of a Webb County resident was a male in his early-90s. He died on Tuesday, September 14, 2021.

- The 926<sup>th</sup> death of a Webb County resident was a male in his early-40s. He died on Wednesday, September 15, 2021.

As of 5:00 PM on Wednesday, September 15, 2021, a total of: 416,956 people have been tested; 51,417 have resulted positive; 410 are estimated active (**as of 9/15/2021**) (**9/14/2021: 378**).

Of the 410 active cases:

- 138 cases are below the age of 17
- 110 cases are between the ages of 18-30
- 95 cases are between the ages 31-49
- 67 cases are above the age of 50
- Of the active investigated, 288 cases are not vaccinated (71.82%)
- 63 total year to date vaccine breakthrough cases

Furthermore, 50,081 are estimated recovered (**9/14/2021: 50,003**); 52 are currently hospitalized; 28 of those in the COVID ICU. The hospitalization rate is at 11.29% as of 9/15/21 (**9/14/2021: 12.16%**) and 926 people have died.

Vaccine Statistics:

- Population 12+ vaccinated with at least one dose: 224,406
- Population 12+ who are fully vaccinated: 186,649
- Population 65+ vaccinated with at least one dose: 26,221

In order to safeguard legally-protected information, the City of Laredo is not publicly releasing personal or identifiable information regarding any cases as it relates to COVID-19, results or monitoring. Stay home if you are sick and call your doctor. Do not go to the doctor's office, call them first. If it is an emergency, call 9-1-1. Please continue to do your part in preventing the spread of all diseases.

Follow the guidelines below:

- Follow CDC and WHO guidelines and practice physical distancing
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Hand sanitizer can be used when soap and water are not readily available.
- Wear a mask or face covering (if you are unvaccinated)
- Avoid touching your face

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Stay home when you are sick
- Cover all coughs and sneezes
- Clean frequently-touched surfaces
